From Sunday, April 19 to Friday, April 24 2026

On Sunday, April 19, 24 students (and their teachers) from Monbrison, Berlin and Roccapiemonte arrived in Roskilde (or Copenhagen) where they were welcomed by their Danish hosts. The students spent the resto of the afternoon and evening with their Danish hosts and the host families.

On Monday, April 20, all students and teachers met at Himmelev Gymnasium. They were given a guided tour of the school and took part in various team building activities arranged by the Danish students.



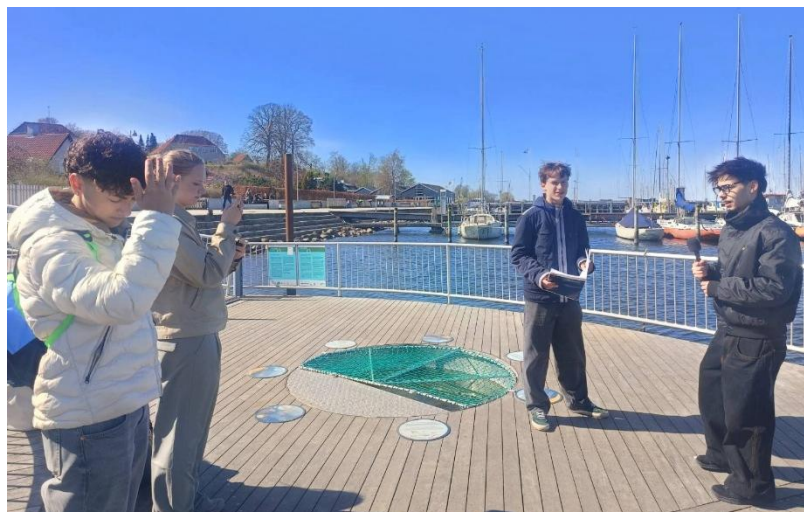
The students from France, Germany and Italy presented their videos which they had produced at home about climate changes in their local areas.



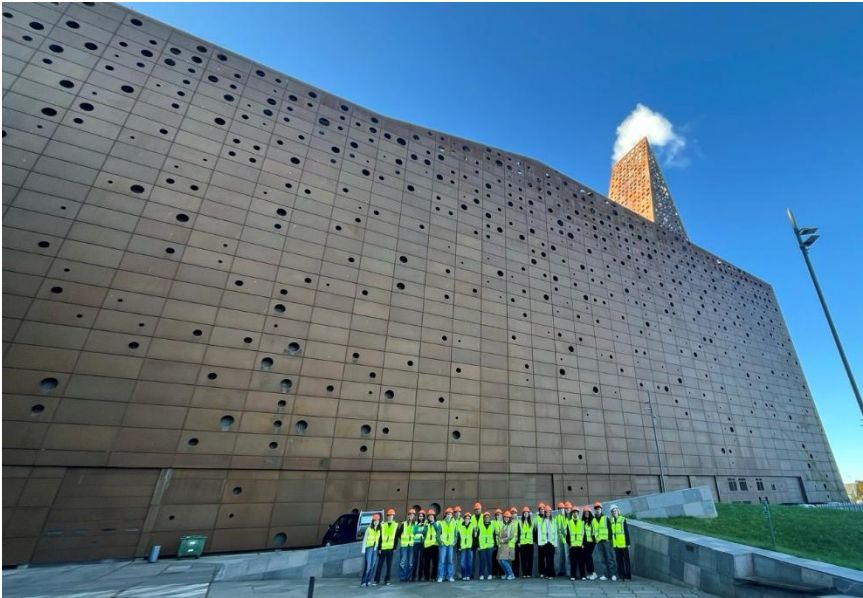
In mixed, international groups the students brainstormed about the videos they were to make about the measures implemented in Roskilde to prevent damages caused by climate change.



In the afternoon, all students and teachers walked to Roskilde Harbour to look at and make recordings of the coastal protection projects that have been carried out to protect the harbor and coastal areas from future floods.



On Tuesday morning, April 21, the Erasmus group visited the Energy Tower, a waste to energy facility in Roskilde. Students and teachers were given a guided tour of the Energy Tower, and they attended a lecture about the conversion of waste into district heating and electricity.



From the Energy Tower, the students walked to Zealand Business College to participate in a sustainable cooking class, titled “How to make your dinner more climate friendly”.



After the cooking class, students and teachers had the opportunity of tasting the delicious, sustainable food that the students had prepared.



Later in the afternoon, everybody visited Musicon, an award-winning urban and recreational area that combines climate adaptation with playground areas, culture, music, educational institutions, housing and restaurants.



On Wednesday, April 22, in the morning, the students continued their work on the videos about climate changes and climate damage prevention in Roskilde.



After lunch, all students and teachers went to Copenhagen where we spent the afternoon and evening. We went on a canal boat tour around the harbour and the canals of Copenhagen and visited some of the most famous sights of the city.



On Thursday, April 23, the students spent the morning finishing their videos. Before presenting their videos about Roskilde, all students took a quiz in order to test their knowledge of the EU.



Students and teachers spent Thursday afternoon taking part in various sports activities such as floorball, badminton, volleyball, and “round ball” (a Danish version of softball).



Thursday night, students and teachers celebrated the completion of our Erasmus project “Back to a Desirable Future” and our final evening together.



On Friday morning, April 24, the students and teachers from France, Italy and Germany departed from Roskilde, and everybody said their heartfelt goodbyes after having spent an intensive and wonderful week together.
